## TRAINING DAYS

The following are available for the first half of 2017

These are intended for all levels of experience and ability although a basic understanding of bookbinding will be beneficial. They are limited to a maximum of eight students.

Dates	Topic	Tutor
<b>Saturday 21 January</b>	<b>Paper/Vellum Limp Bindings</b> A simple strong paper or vellum case into which sections are individually sewn. No adhesives are required.	<b>Maureen Duke</b>
<b>Saturday 18 February</b>	<b>Non-Adhesive Bindings and Exposed Sewing</b> Make an exposed stitched notebook using an assortment of papers, envelopes etc. with leather spine and fabric/bookcloth boards.	<b>Janine Pope</b>
<b>Sunday 19 February</b>	<b>Hedi Kyle structures</b> Making books based on a concertina, including flag book, crown and Blizzard book and, if there is time, a couple of others.	<b>Janine Pope</b>
<b>Saturday 18 March</b>	<b>Binding single sheets and Binding Music</b> This practical class will cover ways of binding single sheets in a hard cover. There will also be a demonstration of binding sheet music to allow it to open flat.	<b>Rachel Ward-Sale</b>
<b>Saturday 22 April</b>	<b>Finishing with gold leaf</b> Preparing leather and learning to use finishing tools with genuine loose gold leaf.	<b>Maureen Duke</b>
<b>Saturday 13 May</b>	<b>Design lettering on volumes</b> Lettering techniques using type, labels, blocking methods and cut letters. Traditional and modern ways of working. Demonstrations and student practice.	<b>David Mills</b>
<b>17 June</b>	<b>Spring Back / Ledger Binding</b> This technique is similar to Library Style. Making and incorporating a Spring Back which enables the book to open flat.	<b>Maureen Duke</b>

Each Training Day costs £35 (payable in advance) and there will be an additional charge of £5.00 per person payable directly to the Tutor at each session for materials etc.

All courses take place at the club's bindery in Winchester and run from 10:30 to about 16:00
