TRAVEL INFORMATION

Bath University is situated 1 Mile from the City Centre with excellent Rail, Bus, and Road Links. Bristol Airport operates a Shuttle Bus to Bath.

By Car: Bath is located 10 miles from Junction18 of the M4 motorway which connects directly with London and its Airports. There are also excellent links to and from the West and North via the M5 Motorway, Whilst Wales is just a short drive West on the M4. Parking will be in the East Car Park (post Code BA2 7PD) Indicate if coming by car and a permit will be sent to you.

By Rail: There are regular train services direct from London Paddington to Bath Spa, with an average journey time of around 90 minutes. Bristol Temple Meads, just 15 minutes away by train, is also a major hub for travel to all other parts of the country. For information on timetables visit www.gwr.com or www.nationalrail.co.uk, and www.travelline.info. Direct from the train station is a University Bus running approximately every 8 Minutes.

By Bus and Coach: Main Bus terminal alongside Train Station with link to University as above. National Express provides good-value coach travel linking all major towns and cities in the UK. Frequent services to Bath run from London Victoria Coach Station, London Heathrow and London Gatwick. For information on timetables visit www.gobycoach.co.uk or www.nationalexpress.com

By Air: Just 19 miles from Bath, Bristol Airport offers direct scheduled flights from 117 locations across 30 countries, including 17 capital cities and offers convenient worldwide connections. The Bath Bus Company operates a service to/from Bath from the airport every half an hour. For more information visit www.bristolairport.co.uk

FEES

Full delegates: members £380, non-members £400. This covers accommodation and all meals including the Conference Dinner from Thursday evening to Sunday morning.

Day delegates: members £120, non-members £130, This covers lunch and refreshments but not dinner. Conference Dinner: £45 (for day delegates, suppliers, spouses and other guests). Please note there will be no other catering for Conference delegates on campus that evening.

Full delegates may pay a deposit of £100 and the balance by 31st May. A late booking fee of £20 will apply after this date. Final cut off date for applying will be 15th July 2022. Cancellation: fees will be refunded (less £20 administration charge) for cancellations made before 15th July 2022.

Accommodation Only prior to the conference has been arranged at the Campus for delegates wishing to arrive earlier in order to be able to take advantage of visiting the City of Bath. This would be booked direct with the University, details of which will be sent to you on application. This can also apply if you also wish to stop at the end of the Conference. Non-attending spouses, partners and friends may book bed and breakfast for £50 per night plus £16.50 for dinner. Mobility scooters will be available upon request prior to Conference. Please indicate on the application form if you would like one of these.




